I have long admired the creators of this rarely produced musical that premiered on Broadway in 1998. Its creative team was impressive: Alfred Uhry famous for, among other things, Driving Miss Daisy; Jason Robert Brown, who in addition to being one of my favorite living Broadway composers, wrote the score for ATG's hugely successful New Jersey Premiere of The Bridges of Madison County; and the legendary Hal Prince.

With this pedigree and a pocket of Tony Awards, one would have anticipated a more hospitable reception than the one it received on Broadway, 25 years ago. And one would expect it to be a regular staple of regional and professional productions. Yes, I am well aware that **Parade** began previews on Broadway at the same time American Theater Group's production went into rehearsal. Not that it matters, but for the record, ATG had gotten the rights to mount the first NJ professional production long before the NY production was announced.

Why now?

Because the message is manifestly current. Today, many of our national leaders are at best oblivious and, at worst, openly receptive to blatant displays of intolerance, racism and bigotry. They dine with avowed ant-Semites and do so with relative impunity. As I write this, the police recently arrested a man for attempting to bomb a synagogue only miles away from where we will be performing. And a group of neo-Nazis were at the first preview of the Broadway production, spreading the same lies that were spewed over 100 years ago.

Parade was written in recognition of the dangers of such action and inaction. It is about Leo Frank, a man convicted of a crime not because of the evidence but because of his religion. **Parade** is an incredibly talented piece: the score is rich and the book is wonderfully crafted. This event is powerful, daring, unsettling and not to be missed.

Today, with the stakes so high and the dangers so obvious, to choose not to speak out, to not use one's voice is worse than silence: it is acquiescence. By producing **Parade**, American Theater Group chooses to use its voice.

We hope you will enjoy this production. We welcome you in the sincere belief you will be moved by its power.
